

YOUR VOTING RIGHTS IN NEW YORK STATE

Are you a U.S. citizen?

Are you 18 or older?

YOU CAN VOTE! EVEN IF YOU:

Are homeless

Have been arrested before

Are on Probation

Are awaiting trial in jail

Have been convicted of a misdemeanor

Have completed your felony sentence

Unless you have been convicted of a **felony AND** you are **currently incarcerated**, or you are **currently on parole**, **YOU CAN VOTE.**

Once you have completed your period of incarceration or parole you can re-register and vote. While you are on parole, you may apply for a Certificate of Relief from Disabilities or Certificate of Good Conduct, which, if granted, allows you to register and vote.
