What is the best way to prepare for a superintendent's suspension hearing (from district schools)? What are a students' rights to alternative education? Where do I find an advocate to represent a student?

STATE CENTRAL REGISTER

The State Central Register receives telephone calls alleging child abuse or maltreatment in New York. What does it mean to have a record with the State Central Register, and how do I find out if I have one? What are my options if I want to challenge my record with the State Central Register?

### 5:30 -FAIR CHANCE ACT

If you are looking for work in NYC and 6:00 have been convicted of a crime before, learn about the Fair Chance Act. What constitutes a violation of the Fair Chance Act? How can I file a complaint if I have been discriminated against?

## 6:00 -**IMMIGRATION KNOW YOUR RIGHTS**

Who is at risk for ICE arrest or for deportation? How does having a criminal case affect my risk of deportation? What are my rights if ICE arrests me? What can I do ICE arrests my family/loved one?

# 6:30 -PERMANENT EXCLUSION

If you live in NYCHA and have a family 7:00 member that is not allowed to visit or live with you because of an arrest or conviction, learn about Permanent Exclusion. Is there a way to get permission from NYCHA to have them visit or live with you? How do you apply to lift a Permanent Exclusion?

### 7:00 -POLICE KNOW YOUR RIGHTS

What are my rights if a police starts a conversation with me, detains me, or arrests me? What can I do if the police has violated my rights?
